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Message from the President



Dear Colleagues,

We have completed three years after we faced the COVID-19 pandemic. We are now one year nearer to SDG being fulfilled in 2030. Let's have a closer look at the world's situation in this regard. "The Sustainable Development Goals Report 2022" has been released.

Unfortunately, the effect of the pandemic has caused deterioration in almost all goals. Additionally, we are in an era with the highest number of conflicts all over the world since the establishment of the United Nations.

The total number of people living in extreme poverty is estimated to be 657-676 million compared to 581 million in the pre-pandemic period. Conflict, COVID-19, climate change, and growing inequalities converge to increase food insecurity worldwide. To reduce stunting in children by 50% by 2030, the annual rate of decline has to double.

The COVID-19 pandemic is threatening decades of progress in global health. As of mid-2022, more than 500 million people got infected, leading to 15 million deaths. Increased demand caused a disruption in essential health services in 92% of countries. Global life expectancy and immunization coverage decreased, and the prevalence of anxiety and depression increased, particularly among young people and women. Compared to 2019, 3.7 million more children adding up to 22.7 million missed basic vaccines in 2020. The pandemic claimed the lives of 115,500 front-line healthcare workers.

Although action has been taken to recover education, 147 million children missed more than half of in-person instruction, and it is estimated that 24 million students from pre-primary to university may never return to school.

Climate change is giving a "red code" warning, with increasing CO2 emissions by 6% in 2021, reaching the highest level ever, and rising global temperatures leading to more extreme weather. Increased heatwaves, droughts, and floods are affecting billions of people worldwide, contributing further to poverty, hunger, and instability.

A quarter of the global population is living in conflict-affected countries. As of 2022, 100 million people have been forcibly displaced worldwide, and it is estimated that 41 % are children.

Numbers in the SDGs not mentioned here are, unfortunately, on regression, except an increase in the percentage of individuals using the internet increased from 54% to 63%.

All the figures put a great toll on all stakeholders. As pediatricians, while healing children, we have to act to heal the world.

IPA supports and advocates for all SDGs for "Every Child, Every Age, Everywhere." I wish you all a happy, healthy, and peaceful new year.

Transforming our world: the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development was unanimously agreed upon by the 193 member states of the UN General Assembly in October 2015. Numerous child-focused indicators are within each goal, and we are now halfway to 2030, which marks the finish line of these global targets.

With the COVID-19 pandemic in its third year, however, decades of development gains are severely disrupted, further delaying the progress on the SDGs. As such, progress can be accelerated by prioritizing children's rights in action plans on the SDGs, as a child rights-based approach multiplies future development gains. It is now up to all of us to join forces to address the challenges and turn goals into action. Therefore, partnerships among member pediatric societies, respective government agencies, academic institutions, local governments, private businesses, and civil society organizations are urgently needed to ensure no child is left behind.

As the only global body representing the professional societies of pediatricians, IPA continuously advocates for children worldwide. We are also working with members and other associations to conduct webinar series for healthcare professionals. Since January this year, IPA has committed to providing support in developing high-quality educational content by holding 20 international webinars by far. Recordings are available to access on the [IPA website](#). In the last quarter of the year 2022, IPA also submitted statements on Non-Communicable Diseases for children's well-being at the WHO Regional Committee of South-East Asia, Europe, and Western Pacific. I hereby would like to express my gratitude to the IPA Executive and Standing Committee, Strategic Advisory Groups, and all member societies for their undying support in serving "Every Child, Every Age, Everywhere."

Welcoming the year 2023, I invite IPA members to register for the IPA Council of Delegates Meeting 2023 (contact: adminoffice@ipa-world.org) and the "30th International Pediatric Association Congress & 60th Annual Conference of the Indian Academy of Pediatrics" (<https://ipa2023congress.org>) in India on 19-23 February 2023.

On 5-9 September 2022, the 75th Session of the WHO Regional Committee for South-East Asia (RC75 SEARO) was held in a hybrid format in Paro, Bhutan. **Dr. Aman Pulungan** (IPA Executive Director and Co-Chair of IPA Strategic Advisory Group/SAG on Noncommunicable Diseases (NCD)) represented IPA at the meeting by submitting a written statement on *Agenda Item 9.2. 

During the panel discussion on "Industry Influence and Sponsorship: Personal and Professional Reflections", Dr. Thacker highlighted IPA's stance

It was emphasized that the IPA has consistently supported the WHO International Code of Marketing Breastmilk Substitutes and will continue its efforts to promote this mutual view. IPA has been clear in refusing to accept BMS marketing and will continue to do so moving forward. Dr. Thacker raised the importance of building awareness around marketing tactics from companies, emphasizing a need to be cautious around potential encounters. 

American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP)

The American Academy of Pediatrics is expanding work on early childhood development through two new partnerships in the Middle East. This quarter we have conducted trainings in Jordan and the United Arab Emirates.

In Jordan, we are working with the Royal Health Awareness Society to train a group of pediatricians from Jordan in early childhood development and nurturing care. The training included sessions on the science of ECD, incorporating nurturing care into practice, and identifying developmental differences. Pediatricians made action plans and established how they would train other pediatricians in Jordan in the same material. The AAP will now work with these pediatricians over the next six months in a

telementoring format to support them in training others and maintaining their new skills.

In Abu Dhabi, we are working with the Abu Dhabi Early Childhood Authority to train pediatricians in developmental surveillance and communications. A two-part training was developed with an online learning opportunity around developmental surveillance, and then a 5-hour virtual live training focused on developmental surveillance, communications, and incorporating surveillance into practice. Over 75 pediatricians in Abu Dhabi attended the virtual live training. This was a pilot training with the expectation that this approach would be scaled up across Abu Dhabi and beyond



Dr. Carlos Alonso Rivera, President of ALAPE, attended the 33rd National Congress of Pediatrics and the 21st National Congress of Neonatology of the Association of Pediatricians of El Salvador and presented on "Use of screens audits impact on neurodevelopment."



Last November 3rd celebrated the 24th Biannual Congress of the Central and Western Pediatrics Federation (Mexico), where Dr. Alonso was honored. In an emotional ceremony, authorities and fellow pediatricians paid tribute to Dr. Alonso's brilliant 38-year career as a physician and his contributions to pediatric neurology in the region.



EAP co-organised a stakeholder workshop in the European Parliament in Brussels

EAP co-organized a stakeholder workshop in the European Parliament in Brussels addressing the hot topic “Breastfeeding promotion and a public-private partnership for infant nutrition – are they compatible?” Featuring speakers from EAP, WHO Regional Office for Europe, a Parent Organisation and a Dietetic Industry Association, the session sought to understand how breastfeeding is promoted while simultaneously ensuring that mothers who do not provide breastfeeding receive evidence-based and current information on substitute options. The panelists concluded that close collaboration and a relationship of mutual trust between paediatricians and other healthcare professionals, families, and the public sector is needed to achieve progress.

The month concluded with the 4th Congress of Paediatricians of Serbia (Vrdnik, Serbia) from 29th September to 2nd October 2022. EAP’s president had the honor of opening the Congress during the welcome address.

Barcelona, Spain, was the heart of paediatrics in Europe during the EAPS Congress, organized by the three leading European societies: the European Academy of Paediatrics (EAP), the European Society for Paediatric Research (ESPR), and the European Society of Paediatric and Neonatal Intensive Care (ESPNIC), from 7 and 11 October 2022. The EAP President and Organising Committee Chair announced proudly that 3,192 Participants (77% in-person) joined the event from 108 countries. There was a large, inspiring presence of young doctors. The EAP Young Investigator Award was presented to 17-year-old **Saanvi Mehra** for the outstanding presentation “Down Syndrome Detection through Graphical Analysis of Facial Dysmorphic Features in Newborn Children with Ethnicity/racial slicing – an ai/MI-based approach.” EAP thanks its representatives for their hard work and efforts to bring the best and brightest minds in paediatrics to EAPS.

European Academy of Paediatrics

The European Academy of Paediatrics concluded 2022 with a busy fourth quarter.

The month of September kicked off with a presentation by EAP President and IPA Standing Committee member, **Adamos Hadjipanayis** at the IPA Executive and Standing Committee meeting beginning September in Istanbul, Turkey. 
Another EAP initiative by young paediatricians (**Francesca Seregni, Valentina Ferraro, and Kathy Gallagher**, led by **Rob Ross Russell and Liviana da Dalt**): on the 21st and 22nd October, the online [Core Knowledge in Paediatrics \(CKP\)](#) course took place close to 150 participants. This virtual course and the [EAP Learning](#) application (a “virtual classroom” available on mobile, tablet, or laptop) are the early shoots of strong and valuable training. A particular shout out to

them for their enthusiasm.

The 4th EBP Examination took place on 22nd November 2022, with a total of 252 candidates taking part. 174 candidates sat the exam online. A new, highly successful initiative this year saw 78 candidates sitting the exam as part of onsite group bookings with local invigilators. Examination results are due to be issued by Christmas.

During the **Strategic Advisory Group meetings on 2nd December**, an exciting highlight was the presentation of preliminary results of a survey conducted by [Choosing Wisely](#) Advisory Group & the [EAPRASnet](#) Steering Committee on over-diagnostics and over-treatment in Paediatrics throughout Europe. This initiative was embraced by the Japan Pediatric Society. An independently distributed survey on the EAPRASnet website in Japan received over 500 responses out of a total of 3353 replies.

Before the traditional update on EAP matters in 2022 by the President of the EAP, **Javier Hernandez Reta**, President of Duracell Europe & Africa, accentuated a new collaboration between EAP and Duracell on preventing accidental Lithium coin ingestions. More than 50% of the 10,000 cases of Lithium Coin cell ingestion accidents in households reported in 2020 took place in Europe. EAP and Duracell aim to significantly minimize the risk of Lithium Coin Cell ingestion across Europe by driving awareness of the topic among **parents** and **paediatricians** and educating them on how to best prevent and detect it.

The 22nd Congress of the Union of Arab Pediatric Societies and the 18th International Conference of Jordan Pediatric Society, Amman-Jordan, 26th-29th October 2022



It was the largest scientific event held in Jordan in 2022, this event had a lot of striking features.

The participation of 43 international speakers from the United States, Europe, Africa, and Asia who are very famous figures in their field. The event included 6 workshops, Nutrition, Obesity, Hypertension, and the Golden Hour

in the resuscitation of the newborn. Also, there were 8 specialized symposiums, RSV, Influenza, Varicella, and Meningitis vaccines, to impact the importance of vaccination for the pediatrician in addition to two symposiums about bleeding disorders and most update in treating hemophilia. There were 18 sessions and 91 lectures in the form of oral presentations as well as 10 posters.

More than 700 pediatricians from Jordan and different Arab countries, in addition to intern doctors as well as medical students, attended this event. Feedback from participants and authorities was strongly positive, overall, we can say that the success of the event was more than expected.

"The Development of Newborn Screening: Moving Beyond the 1960's"

Webinar by IPA SAG on Non-communicable Diseases

On 1st October 2022, the International Pediatric Association conducted a webinar entitled "The Development of Newborn Screening: Moving Beyond the 1960's", drawing over 1,000 registrants from 73 countries. To officially open the webinar, **Prof. Enver Hasanoglu** delivered his

opening address highlighting how newborn screening (NBS) is an integrated public health program essential to promptly detect and diagnose various curable but life-threatening diseases. A representative from the Ministry of Health, Republic of Indonesia, **Ms. Endang Sumiwi**, represented Mr. Budi Gunadi Sadikin as the Minister of Health, Republic of Indonesia, to deliver the keynote address.

Dr. Natasha Heather from New Zealand began the series of presentations by sharing insights on the screening of congenital hypothyroidism in Australia/New Zealand. In her presentation, she highlighted the importance of all parts of a system working well in ensuring a good screening process. **Dr. Ellen Crushell** from Ireland then discussed the procedures, logistics, and ethical considerations of NBS programs in Ireland. **Dr. Osama Aldirbashi** from Qatar focused on discussing the history, screening criteria, target disorders as well as the future of NBS in his presentation.

As panelists in the webinar, **Prof. Aman Pulungan** from Indonesia and **Dr. Dipesalema Joel** from Botswana shared the experiences, progress, and challenges of NBS in Indonesia and in the African region, respectively. The question and answer

session was conducted with all speakers and panelists, moderated by **Prof. Feyza Darendeliler** from Turkey and **Dr. Basim Al-Zoubi** from Jordan as moderators of the webinar. The webinar recording is available [here](#).

“IPA/ UNICEF/ WHO Webinar: Preventing Children’s Lead Exposure”

Webinar by IPA SAG on Environmental Health

The International Pediatric Association Strategic Advisory Group on Environmental Health conducted a webinar titled “Preventing Children’s Lead Exposure” on the 27th of October 2022, which drew 460 registrants from 65 countries. **Dr. Linda Arnold** delivered the Opening Remarks as IPA’s Coordinator of Development, highlighting the importance of lead prevention as it could lead to long-term disabilities in children. **Dr. Aboubacar Campo** followed by adding the work UNICEF does in developing countries to prevent lead exposure. **Dr. Maria Neira** then underlined the recommendation from the WHO to prevent and raise awareness of lead exposure.

Dr. Desiree Narvaez highlighted UNICEF’s work on lead, including policies and legislation, online learning courses, and key partners with the WHO and IPA to protect children’s lead poisoning. **Lesley Onyon** then applauded every stakeholder collaborating with the WHO to reduce lead exposure in society, especially in children. **Prof. Elif Ozmert**, as moderator, introduced the first

speaker **Prof. Stephan Boese-O’Reilly**, who dove deep into the alarming data of high quantities of lead exposure in children in Kabwe, Zambia. **Prof. Tudor Lucian Pop** then presented data from Romania, including recommendations to reduce lead exposure by removing lead from petrol, cosmetics, food containers, medicine, and water pipes. **Dr. Ramesh Bajania** then highlighted the hardship of eliminating lead from folk medicine, as it is integrated into the people’s culture and beliefs in India. **Prof. Salman Mroueh** concluded that the problem of lead exposure in Lebanon and other countries is strongly related to the undereducation of its toxic effects on health. In her presentation, Dr. Michelle Niescierenko detailed health conditions that affect children, from trauma and injuries to mental health. Therefore, highlighting the importance of strengthening community and family support.

Practical Approaches to Improving Teaching and Learning in Busy Clinical Settings

The IPA Education and Advocacy SC Subcommittee finally continued the monthly webinar series by collaborating with IPALA. IPA was honored to have three notable speakers, **Dr. Amy Gray, Dr. Haroon Saloojee, and Dr. Sanjay Lala**, share their expertise on the 2nd December 2022.

Prof. Enver Hasanoglu, IPA President, officially opened the webinar. In his remarks, he highlighted that in many settings, young learners, as the future of pediatrics, are still facing many high burdens of the clinical ward, which may prevent successful teaching and learning in clinical activities. Even though there have been significant advances in teaching techniques during the pandemic, it needs to be improved and distributed equally. Therefore, IPA calls all pediatricians and educators to take action to advocate and improve teaching and learning in busy clinical settings, as our

children's future is with young and well-trained pediatricians.

Dr. Saloojee presented the importance of incorporating evidence-based practice concepts in work, including practical tips on how it can be done in the clinical setting. He highlighted that EBP is more likely to be successful if the practice is undertaken as a team effort within the institutional structure. Dr. Gray continued the session by explaining the current situation of the ward round and shared a framework that could be used to improve the teaching and learning developed from research in a pediatric hospital. Finally, Dr. Lala presented the purposeful practice and how it can be applied to pediatric examination skills and develop expertise. He also emphasized that purposeful practice could be implemented if we have the commitment, time, and effort to develop clinical scripts or drills. Dr. Gray then moderated the Q&A session and tried to address questions from the attendees. 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
